

## **Lindsey Igler's Art is selected!**

**Marcia Williams student Lindsey Igler will have her United States flag on display at the Santa Clara County Office of Education.**



The purpose of the flag project was to integrate standards from Social Studies and Visual Arts. This project was part of a larger unit on Patriotic Symbols - we studied the lives of Washington and Lincoln. We learned about the White House and the job of the president as well as learning the meaning of the words of the Pledge of Allegiance and Star Spangled Banner. Students also learned the symbolism of the features of the flag. Two members from the Los Gatos Lion's Club (including Sharon DeMeo's dad) came in and talked about the flag.

The specific standards covered are:

- Social Studies standard 1.3: Students know and understand the symbols, icons, and traditions of the US that provide continuity and a sense of community across time.
- Art standard 1.3 and 2.7: Emphasize line, color, shape, form and texture. Use visual and actual texture in original works of art.

Artwork from eight Lakeside students has been submitted to the Santa Clara County Office of Education for consideration for inclusion in the County Office Permanent Art Collection.

Media included watercolor, oil pastel, and acrylic using paper and fabric. At the end of April, participants will be notified if their artwork is selected for the Permanent Art Collection. Art chosen for display is matted and framed. The walls of three floors of hallways at the Ridder Park Drive building are adorned with student art from schools throughout Santa Clara County.
